





Throughout this annual you may find many maritime, community, youth, educational and humanitarian causes supported by our caring, fun-loving SYC members.



BARCLAY SOUND DREAM TRIP

We have long dreamed of going to Barclay Sound on the west coast of Vancouver Island, but the skipper had been reluctant to try the voyage out through Juan de Fuca and into the ocean. Some fellow club members planned a trip in 2018, and we decided to give it a try. After attending the pig roast on Gabriola Island we were making our way south through the Gulf Islands to the planned rendezvous when we received a phone call with a family emergency. We decided to try the Barclay Sound trip the following year.

The next year came with the Covid-19 pandemic and the border closing as did the following year.

Finally in 2022, we met with a few club members (Karneys, Budnarchuks, Myers, Shemlys) to take the trip which started in Cadboro Bay at the Royal Victoria Yacht

Club. The rains and fog also joined us there to the extent that we delayed our departure one day. On the next morning we set out from RVYC to take the trip to Port Renfrew through the mist. Arrival at Port Renfrew was uneventful after about 7 hours of traveling. On the next day it was on to Barclay Sound arriving at Port Desire in a little over 6 hours. Then we were off to Bamfield in the dinghy (for ice cream) and later moving to Nettle Island, then to Turtle Island and to Turret Island. The were anchorages protected and



uncrowded, and side trips led by club members to the sea caves and a lagoon for exploring were wonderful. Next we broke off from the group to get some provisioning in Ucluelet where met Gerry Heys, and we enjoyed a couple of restaurant meals, and more ice cream.

We then left for Pipestem Inlet back into the eastern part of Barclay Sound. We found a little bay whose only occupant was a small female black bear who visited the beach every morning, crunching on oysters. We stayed for a second night so that the maintenance crew (me) could repair a nasty plumbing problem (most plumbing problems on a boat are nasty). There is an inlet that leads to Lucky Creek waterfall which we did by dinghy, a beautiful unspoiled piece of wilderness. Next we were on to Williams Island and then to Joe's Bay to meet up with our group for the trip to return home.

The homeward trip to Port Renfrew presented us with 8 foot swells and a not so smooth ride. Fortunately the next day's voyage to Sooke was very calm and a shorter journey. After Sooke we went to Garrison Bay on San Juan Island. While there, we jointly had a boating realization that we had accomplished a long sought goal of reaching Barclay Sound, and we had reached the end of our 37 year boating journey. We had become aware in the last few years that long voyages of over 4 hours caused the skipper to get very tired and be less effective at managing the boat. In the next few weeks the boat was sold and we are now looking to find other adventures that we can take during our "senior" years. We have WONDERFUL memories of our boating trips.

There is plenty to do while staying at Roche Harbor, Kayaking and outdoor swimming pool, walk through the San Juan Islands Sculpture Park just across the street from the Marina. Walk to the San Juan Gin Distillery, or a short walk to the After Glow Vista, formally known as the John S McMillin Memorial Mausoleum (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Afterglow_Vista. 

SE Alaska May 2016

I had been to SE Alaska twice before, once on a commercial Seiner and once with Cheryl cruising on a friend's boat. I had done the Inside Passage bringing the Seiner back

to Bellingham but for Cheryl the Inside Passage Cruise would be her first.

We found this Classic boat at the Victoria Classic Boat Festival in the fall of 2015. We both loved it, so we persuaded two other couples to join us on a cruise up the inside Passage in the spring of 2016.

The boat was an 1931, 86 foot Classic Fantail Motor Yacht owned by a Seattle guy named Ben Swanson The boat winters in Lake Union and spends the summers in SE Alaska on Charters. It came with a crew of 5, which included a Gourmet Chef, a former TV celebrity Chef from the Show "Master Chef" all food, beer and wine was included, as well as Kayaks and Skiffs.

The Inside Passage cruise normally starts in Seattle but for us Capt. Ben agreed to conveniently pick us up in Anacortes. The itinerary was somewhat flexible but included stops at Nanaimo, Cambell River, Blunden Harbor, Pruth Bay, Baker Inlet, Shearwater, Ketchikan, Petersburg, Tracy Arm (Glaciers), Juneau and several other lesser known anchorages along the way.

The boat cruised at a leisurely 10 knots and was whisper quiet and exceptionally smooth, Meals were over the top with a lot of fresh caught local seafood. It was really a treat not to have to provision, worry about breakdowns, weather decisions or dragging anchor among other things. We got to see a lot of wildlife, Black Bear, Brown Bear, Wolves, Sea Otter and of course, a lot of Whales.

Our favorite stop was Petersburg. We happened to be there for their Nordic Festival which really made our day. The cruise ended in Juneau, so we flew from there to Sitka for a couple days to cap off the trip. Returned home via Alaska Air to Bellingham. Would definitely do it again. Actually we did just that 2 years later. That time a 1929 76 foot boat out of Friday Harbor. 4 guests, 2 crew, custom itinerary. Caught a 65 Lb.





Carrying a comprehensive first aid kit in a watertight container on board means you have the ability to help whatever the circumstances.

A good first aid kit should include:

- Gauze, bandages and waterproof band-aids
- · Adhesive tape
- Gloves
- Scissors
- Antiseptic
- Pain relievers
- Tweezers
- Anti-histamines
- Anti-nausea medication
- Sunscreen
- Spare prescription medications
- Emergency blankets

For the United States, an official government-source documenting the regulations on the contents of your on-board First Aid Kit was not found. After a 7 year effort Drayton Harbor Maritime (DHM) restored the ferry to its original configuration, and relaunched her in 1996 for her third career.


The Society launched a new website last year (www.bcmpfs.ca) which includes a page for the stern ties with small charts showing how many and the general locations where on the beach you'll find them.
